

Do I need to submit a portfolio?

Applying for one of our art and design programmes? As well as meeting our academic entry requirements, you will need to submit an art and design portfolio if you have no academic background in art and design.*

WHAT WE WANT TO SEE

The below table shows you what we need to see in your portfolio if you'd like to study our 3-semester programme and what we require if you'd like to study our 2-semester programme. If you would like to enrol on a 2-semester art and design programme, you will see that we require slightly more. (Please note that if you hold a Dazhuan Diploma, you can only join the 3-semester programme, even if you have a related academic background in art and design.)

Evidence that you understand your subject	Research into artists/designers within your area of specialism (for example, Fashion or Architecture) and who in particular has inspired you in the direction of your creative work	Extensive research into artists/designers within your area of specialism (for example, Fashion or Architecture), who has inspired you and how they have inspired you in the direction of your creative work
Your final outcomes	Might include one or more of the following formats: • Photographs of physical models or images generated from digital 3D models • Fashion garments/shoots • Jewellery • Paintings • Prints • Videos • Illustrations	Must include one or more of the following formats, presented in a professional manner: • Photographs of physical models or images generated from digital 3D models • Fashion garments/shoots • Jewellery • Paintings • Prints • Videos • Illustrations
Evaluation of your final outcomes	Basic annotations explaining: • Are you happy with your final outcome? Why/why not? • What could you have done to improve it?	Detailed annotations explaining: • Are you happy with your final outcome? Why/why not? • What could you have done to improve it? • What would you do differently next time?
